## **HARBOR LIGHTS**



The **Harbor Lights Interest Project** focuses on the watery area surrounding the island including the Mackinac Bridge, Round Island Lighthouse, and the straits. It will help you to learn about the role the water plays in Mackinac Island's history as well as its current state.

## Requirements:

To earn an Interest Project Patch, complete at least seven (7) activities: 2 Skill Builders, 1 Technology, 1 Service, 1 Career Exploration, and 2 Additional Activities from any category. Your finished project must be complete and should reflect your best work. It will be returned to you if these standards are not met and you will be asked to revise and resubmit your badge work for consideration.

- 1. The Mackinac Bridge connects Michigan's Upper and Lower peninsulas. Who designed the Bridge? In what year was the Bridge construction completed? How long is the Bridge? Who leads off the annual Labor Day Bridge Walk, and what is the starting and ending point?
- 2. A strait is a narrow waterway connecting two large bodies of water. Draw a map of the Mackinac straits area showing and labeling land and water features.
- 3. Two annual yacht races finish their competitions at Mackinac Island. Learn the starting points for each race. Which race covers the longest distance? When are these events held?
- 4. Ferries provide passenger service to Mackinac Island from both Mackinaw City and St. Ignace. Learn about the three different ferry services Mackinac Island has. What are they? Observe the different procedures that occur at each ferry dock and get a brochure from each one. Make a chart comparing the different rates the ferries charge.
- 5. Lighthouses were an important part of early navigation of the Great Lakes. Take a picture of the historic Round Island Lighthouse. Learn when it was built and how long it was in active service.
- 6. The State of Michigan provides marina service on Mackinac Island. How many boats can be docked there at one time? Find out how rental fees are charged. How long may boaters stay? What services are available to users?
- 7. Ore boats are a common site in the straits area. Learn and explain the meaning of "downbound" and "upbound." What product do these boats generally carry? Where might they be coming from or where could they be going?
- 8. The Coast Guard maintains a red warning buoy in the waters off Mission Point Resort. Find out what hazard to navigation exists at that spot. With a buddy, ride a bicycle to Mission Point and look for the buoy. Take a picture of the buoy or of you by the buoy and submit it with your completed badge work.
